WHEREAS, the New Jersey Department Environmental Protection, Green Acres Program (“State”), provides loans and/or grants to municipal and county governments and grants to nonprofit organizations for assistance in the acquisition and development of lands for outdoor recreation and conservation purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Township of Gloucester desires to further the public interest by obtaining a loan of \$334,899.00 and/or grant of \$2,525,000.00 from the State to fund the following project(s): Opens space acquisitions in accordance with the approved “Open space and Recreation Plan for Gloucester Township, Camden County, New Jersey, July 2004,” as prepared by Remington & Vernick Engineers, Inc.

NOW, THEREFORE, the governing body resolves that the Honorable Cindy Rau-Hatton or the successor to the office of Mayor is hereby authorized to:

- (a) make application for such loan and/or such a grant
- (b) provide additional application information and furnish such documents as may be required
- (c) act as the authorized correspondent of the above named applicant, and

WHEREAS, the State shall determine if the application is complete and in conformance with the scope and intent of the Green Acres Program, and notify the applicant of the amount of the funding award: and

WHEREAS, the Applicant is willing to use the State’s funds in accordance with such rules, regulations and applicable statutes, and is willing to enter into an agreement with the State for the above named project;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Council of the Township of Gloucester, County of Camden, New Jersey

1. That the Mayor of the Township of Gloucester is hereby authorized to execute an agreement and any amendment thereto with the State known as the opens space acquisitions in accordance with the approved “Open space and Recreation Plan for Gloucester Township, Camden County, New Jersey, July 2004,” as prepared by Remington & Vernick Engineers, Inc., and;
2. That the applicant has its matching share of the project.
3. That, in the event the State’s funds are less than the total project cost specified above, the applicant has the balance of funding necessary to complete the project, and;

MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor Rau-Hatton stated that she has received word that Gloucester Township is eligible for an Energy Efficiency Block Grant. She stated that the township is eligible for \$564,900.00 and the application is due June 5. She also spoke about the extraordinary aid numbers and stated that the money for the fiscal year towns had been cut twice. She stated that she was disappointed that the Council did not pass the resolution for a new website. She stated that Gloucester Township's website is horrendous. She stated that the Council can't afford not to do this. She stated with a new website, there would be a chance to sell business links and be interactive. She stated that it should not be delayed anymore. She stated that the web designer will teach each department to do their own updating. Mr. Bianchini stated that Joan Eller has been utilizing someone through the CDBG grant for some time. He stated that he reached out to the Mayor concerning the website. Mayor Rau-Hatton stated that the township needs to have a company to do the website. She stated that Council is stalling again. Mr. Hutchison stated that if this could be done for free, why would we pay for it. Mayor Rau-Hatton stated that the website needs to be done professionally. She stated that it is a one-time expense. She said that the Economic Development Corp. stated that they would give the Township between \$7,000.00 and \$8,000.00 for their portion of the website. Mr. Hutchison reiterated that if there is a grant that would pay for the website, then why shouldn't the township look at what he can do. Mayor Rau-Hatton stated that she will speak to this gentlemen and give Council a full report at the workshop.

She also stated that the Berlin-Cross Keys Road bridge has been shut down for 5 days. Mr. Bianchini asked if Mr. Cantwell could reach out to the State to suspend the tolls getting off of the Atlantic City Expressway during this time.

PUBLIC PORTION: Mr. Bianchini opened the meeting to the public.

Dick Edgar stated that there is a newspaper in the lobby that he felt was political in nature and he felt it should not be in the lobby of the municipal building.

Maureen McLaughlin of Empire Avenue spoke about the individual that has been working on the web site for the last few years. She asked if the sub-committee spoke to this gentleman. Mr. Mercado stated that he did not know of this gentleman until two weeks ago. Mr. Mercado stated that he has looked at the site. He said that it already has forms on it. He stated that when they accepted the RFQ's it was a different economic time.

Mrs. Matulewicz of Hillcrest Avenue asked when Gloucester Township was going to get Verizon Fios.

Sarah Bass Young encouraged everyone to go to the Constitution Center in Philadelphia. She asked that the township set up a trip. She also spoke about an slavery exhibit that is currently there. She also spoke about the intersection of Hickstown Road, Sicklerville road and Route 42 off-ramp. She stated that this intersection is a mess. She also spoke about getting a left turn on College Drive adjacent to Camden County College. She stated that this corner needs a left turn signal. Mr. Cantwell will evaluate.

Ray Polidoro of Erial asked about minutes on the website. He spoke about what could be on a new website.

There being no further comment, the public portion was closed.
